



Dear Parents/Players:

Welcome to America United Soccer Club (AUSC). Upon signing your Player-Parent Agreement and returning your signature page to your Manager/Coach, you are also required to submit a registration deposit of \$100.00 made payable to the America United Soccer Club. This registration deposit is necessary to register your son/daughter for the upcoming season and to be registered with the Coast Soccer League, which provides for our gaming circuit. The fees to play in our club are listed as follows:

Boys/Girls U-9 or Older.....\$100.00 per month (exact amount for Boys & Girls U9 & U10 will be determined by their team managers).

Each team manager makes the determination as to how this fee is paid, i.e. monthly, quarterly or annual. Please understand this amount may change due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e. increased trainer fees, additional tournaments, etc.). If you do not meet your financial obligations, your son/daughter can be dropped from the team. If your son/daughter leaves AUSC, and monies are still owed, America United Soccer Club has the right to enforce this agreement using whatever legal recourse it deems necessary.

1. To be considered a team for registration purposes each team must have a minimum of seven (7) players who have paid their dues by May 15 of each year to register the team with the Coast Soccer League for the fall season.
2. Coaches/Teams that do not have a minimum of eleven (11) players by July 19 for U11 or older or eight (8) for U9 & U10 and/or have not paid their dues current will be dropped and will not be bracketed for regular league play for the Fall CSL Season.
3. In addition to dues/fees, you are required to purchase a uniform for your son/daughter. The uniform fee is \$200.00 and includes two (2) socks, two (2) shorts, two (2) jerseys and three (2) practice T-Shirts. We recommend that all players buy at least one additional set of socks.

In order for your son/daughter to be officially part of AUSC we need the following items:

- Complete Player Registration Form
- Three (3) photos, shoulder and up, for players I.D. card
- Original Birth Certificate (only temporarily)
- Sign last page of Player/parent Agreement (contract)
- \$100.00 signing fee (Please make checks payable to: AUSC)
- \$200.00 Uniform fee (Please make checks payable to: AUSC)

Spring and/or Summer Tournaments the number to be determined by Team Manager. (may include Spring Soccer or State Cup)

Winter Tournaments or More than Five Spring & Summer Tournaments
Individual Items or Individual Training
Uniforms

The Southern California University of Health Sciences allows American United Soccer Club to use and maintain the AUSE Complex on the college grounds. In order to maintain the Club's relationship with the College, certain rules of conduct must be enforced. As a member/owner of the America United Soccer Club, You must understand the importance of this relationship and agree to abide by the following rules:

Page Three

1. There is no soccer parking at any time on the upper parking lot located north of the playing fields. This includes dropping off and picking up players before and after practices.
2. Only So Cal Univ Health Science students, faculty and authorized personnel are allowed on the college campus. No one from AUSC is allowed to go in the college campus classroom areas or bathroom facilities.
3. Trash must be picked up at all times. This includes all grass areas as well as the parking lot. Please pick up your trash, put it in the proper receptacles or take it home with you.

Failure to adhere to these rules may result in disciplinary action being taken against your son/daughter or against the team (i.e. monetary fines, loss of field privileges, etc.).

Volunteers

The club has developed a relationship with the Home Depot Center and Anaheim Stadium to allow parents and sons/daughters that want to travel or need assistance with their dues/fees to volunteer and earn money. You are working concessions and must be 14 years of age to work at Home Depot Center and 18 years of age for Anaheim Stadium. You must work hard and project a professional manner when volunteering with the above organizations. Anaheim Stadium requires a four (4) hour training session prior to working there. The funds earned while volunteering have allowed many of our club players to travel abroad and has assisted other with their fees/dues.

We are very proud to have such an alliance with Home Depot Center and Anaheim Stadium.

We also from time to time need volunteers to assist with field maintenance, clean-up, repairs and many other areas. Please contact any of the club officials if you are interested in helping out.

Player Conduct

Every player is expected to:

- Know and respect the rules of soccer and CYSA-South and abide by them at all times.
- Show respect and courtesy to officials and coaches by following their instructions and directions.
- Respect the game officials and refrain from addressing them or commenting on their decisions during or after the game.
- Maintain control of his/her emotions, avoiding the use of abusive or profane language, taunting or humiliating remarks, and/or gestures and physical assault upon another player at any time.

- Respect the coaches and players of the opposing team and display sportsmanship at the conclusion of a game and be humble and generous in victory and proud and courteous in defeat.
- Follow all Association rules, respecting at all times the property of others.

Remember that soccer is a game, and treat players and coaches on other teams as opponents, not enemies.

Parents and Spectators

The parents' role is one of support to the players and coaches. Parents should not engage in "coaching" from the sidelines, criticizing players, coaches or game officials or trying to influence the makeup of the team at any time. Every parent and spectator is expected to:

- Learn and respect the rules of soccer and rules of the CYSA-South
- Show respect and courtesy to game officials, coaches, and players at all times
- Respect the game officials at all times. Refrain from questioning their decisions or from addressing them in a loud, disrespectful, or abusive manner.
- Cheer for your child's team in a positive manner, refraining at all times from making negative or abusive remarks about your team or the opposing team. Maintain control of your emotions and avoid actions, language, and/or gestures that may be interpreted as hostile and humiliating.
- Ensure that your child is at all games and practices at the required time or provide the coach with an appropriate excuse beforehand.
- Demonstrate appropriate gestures of sportsmanship at the conclusion of a game, win or lose.
- Teach and practice good sportsmanship and fair play by personally demonstrating commitment to these virtues.
- Promote the concept that soccer is merely a game, and that players and coaches on other teams are opponents, not enemies.
